## Celebrating 55 Years of Milestones with Love and Learning

This year, St. Frances Cabrini School is proud to honor two outstanding educators whose combined service reflects 55 years of commitment to Catholic education.

**Ms. Patti Delgado**, a beloved Pre-K teacher, is celebrating 30 years at St. Frances Cabrini School, starting her journey on October 22, 1995. Before teaching, she spent two years in the school office supporting the community. Her first Pre-K class graduated in 2007, and many former students now return as parents.

Mrs. Delgado's Pre-K class, known as the "Pre-K Band of Angels," shows care by creating heart and angel crafts to support others. With her joyful spirit and deep faith, she remains a cornerstone of the Cabrini community.




